CAMPER AND PARENT INFORMATION

Thank you for choosing to come to our camp, June 10-16, at Dry Creek, Louisiana. I know that we will have a great week together. Our camp is planned for good kids like you who want to be even better. Here are some details that will help you to plan for the week's activities. **Please note that we are asking you to get some of your forms/information from our website.**

CONFIRMATION: An email will be sent to all families with instructions as to how to know your application status (Accepted or Waiting) and how to confirm that we have all the correct information. If you do not receive this email, contact our office ASAP.

TIMES:
Opening **2:30 to 5:00 p.m., Sunday afternoon, June 10**
Closing 11:00 a.m., Saturday, June 16 - pickup may be made any time after 9:30 a.m.

CHECK-IN:
Time **2:30 to 5:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon, June 10.** Please do not try to check-in before 2:30 p.m. We will not be ready to receive you.

Change Med. Form If there have been changes in the camper's medical condition, medications or personal/insurance information since you mailed in your Medical Form, get a **Change Medical Form** and bring it to **Check-In**.

Please read the form carefully and if you answer **YES to any of the questions** at the top of the form please complete the form and **BRING IT TO CAMP CHECK-IN WITH YOU. DO NOT MAIL the Change Medical Form.** It must be signed by a parent or guardian. Bus riders who have filled out the Change Medical Form should give it to the bus chaperone. If you cannot get on the internet, contact us and we will email or mail you a form.

Medicine All medicine **to be given by the nurse** should be easily accessible in your luggage so that you can turn it in to the nurse in the Cafeteria.

Assignments On arrival, you will be told your Cabin Assignment. Go to your Cabin to receive your Name Tag/Assignment Card and T-shirt. All assignments are made before camp. **NO CHANGES PLEASE!**

SUNDAY SUPPER: No Sunday evening meal will be served. **BRING A SACK SUPPER TO EAT.** Drinks will be sold.

FOOD IN CABINS: No food is to be eaten in the cabins. If you bring food, keep it in your suitcase and eat it outside of the cabin.

ITEMS TO BRING:

Change Med. Form See Check-In above. If you need to fill out a **Change Medical Form**, bring it with you. Do not mail it.

Medicine See Check-In above.

Luggage Limit Be sure to label all luggage with your name and address. Please limit yourself to no more than 2 bags; one large and one small. One bag would be even better since we have so little room in the cabins and on the bus. **Please be cautious when using garbage bags for dirty clothes. Label the outside so it will not be mistaken for trash!!!**

Clothing Mark your name or initials in each item. **PLEASE, MODEST NECKLINES & ARM HOLES; NO TIGHT CLOTHING, MIDRIFTS OR TANK TOPS.** Swimsuit (only modest ones, please) and a cover-up robe for going to and from the pool. If you do not have a cover-up robe, you can change at the pool. An extra pair of shoes (in case of rain). Athletic-type shoes should be worn for sports activities. At least two pairs of long pants or jeans (see next item).

WALKING SHORTS & LONG PANTS: - You are permitted to wear loose fitting walking shorts, pants, or skirts which come to the knee. If your clothing actually touches the knee, you can be assured that its length is appropriate. If your clothing does not touch the knee, you will have to accept the judgment of your counselor as to whether you can wear it. You must bring at least two pairs of long pants or jeans to wear in case your clothing is judged too short. We ask your cooperation in this matter so that camp can be as harmonious as possible. If you feel that you cannot enjoy camp while abiding by these rules, please allow your spot to be taken by someone who is on our waiting list. We do not consider our rules as the standard for absolute right or wrong, but only as a collective judgment as to how a large number of young people can live in harmony for one week. We lovingly solicit your kind cooperation.

Personal Items Soap, towels, washcloths, sheets, pillow, blanket (single bed) and any other miscellaneous personal items.

ITEMS NOT TO BRING TO CAMP:

No radios, stereos, recorders, walkie-talkies, electronic games, etc. We will be making our own music together and interacting with others at camp. (Exception: equipment brought to be used in the talent show.)

Cell Phones

Please Note

Please no cell phones at Camp. If you must have one for travel security, then it must remain in the car or in your luggage and unused (not as a camera, alarm, text messaging, Bible, anything). If a call home is required on your arrival at Camp, make the call before the evening worship assembly time. After that, any phone being used will be taken up and stored in the Office to be picked up Saturday a.m. Emergency calls can be arranged in the Office. Camp is for getting away from your normal routine to create a Camp World for one glorious week. If this is not what you want to do, then please notify us so that we can give your place to another.

Jewelry/Valuables

Expensive watches, rings, jewelry, or other valuables should not be brought. The rooms will not be locked.
